I once heard someone describe discipleship as breathing—inhaling the Spirit of God, taking in what we need, caring for ourselves spiritually, and then exhaling—going and doing—showing the love of God to others, caring for the least, the lost, and the lonely.

I spend much of my time in ministry exhaling caring for others in their time of need. I have been with people when their loved one has just passed, when they've found out their spouse has been unfaithful, or when they just received bad news from their doctor. I sit with people when they're asking the hard questions of faith, preparing for their wedding, or welcoming a new baby. Being a pastor is a beautiful and holy profession that I love. There are no words to describe how honored I feel to exhale alongside of the people of EGUMC. Yet, I know that I can't live by exhaling alone. That is why it is important for me to spend time in different Spiritual disciplines and to take my Sabbath each week, doing my best to guard my time with God and my time of just being "me." I do admit I am not always good at protecting my Sabbath and my time with God.

What I am good at is saying how proud I am of EGUMC. On February 12<sup>th</sup>, we will officially complete our first year together. My prayer has been that we would be a people/church who would live out our vision to be an inviting community who loves God and loves spreading the Good News to all people and that we would be a people who would have just the right balance of inhaling and exhaling. I could not be any more pleased at how you have loved like Jesus, how you are sharing Jesus, and how you have grown spirituality. Yet, I know the pace we have been on and I cannot help to think that, like me, you also need to be reminded to take time to inhale. We will soon enter the season of Lent. I encourage you to make this a time of Spiritual renewal. A time to take a big, deep, sighing breath of God's Spirit. A time to rest in God's presence and "just breathe." I encourage you to make it a time to listen for where God's still small voice is leading you to go and do. A time to find that balance of inhaling and exhaling.

I am continually amazed at the heart and soul of EGUMC. I am excited as we began this New Year of ministry together and cannot wait to inhale and exhale beside you as we love God and work together to spread the Good News to all people!




meeting is Linda Sandiford. We ask all guests to bring lunch for yourself at noon in the Fellowship Hall. Drinks and dessert will be provided.




## Lois's Stitches of Caring - KAREN MULDREW & KAREN STEWART


We're so pleased how far we have come and look forward to expanding this much needed ministry.
