Pressing on with Pastolr Deb - PASTOR DEBRA DAGUE

Spring is often the time I think of new beginnings. I can say that this Spring the thoughts of new beginnings have been very different. I am happy to say that seven months after my TBI, I spent Easter Sunday behind the pulpit bringing the Good News to the people of Elm Grove United Methodist Church. I thank God every day for this miracle and the opportunity for this new beginning in my life.

My accident has changed me in many ways. It has especially changed my understanding of my limitations and boundaries. I have always worked hard in ministry and lived these words of Heri Nouwen, "My own desire to be useful, to do something significant, or to be part of some impressive project is so strong that soon my time is taken up by meetings, conferences, study groups, and workshops." If there is one thing I have learned the last few months is that my TBI has left me with limitations that has challenged me to better boundaries and new ways of doing ministry. In my Chaplain role I would often write in my reports that I offered the ministry of presence to my patients, but it wasn't until my TBI that I really understood the depth and power of this ministry. Being confined to my home, struggling with my limitations and emotions I do see more clearly how I needed to receive ministry. I learned what I needed and what many people need is the comfort that does not necessarily come from words but from the assurance that we are not alone. When we read the Gospel, we actually see Jesus sitting in fellowship. The people Jesus sits with didn't need to know how much Jesus' knew, but they needed to know how much Jesus knew them. Most importantly they needed to know how much Jesus loved them.

I continue on my recovery but the truth is my brain no longer spits out the history of the New Testament with the snap of the finger and I often struggle with the ability to engage in a deep theological discussion. But my desire to love God's children has not changed. My accident has validated the value of the ministry of presence and that I could do better in this ministry. Going out for walks and greeting people, doing some porch sitting, going into people's homes, shooting a few hoops, knowing people by name, listening to their stories, telling my own stories, and letting people know with words, a peace sign, and hugs that I do not simply like them, but truly love them goes far. This is the ministry of presence that I received, and I am still receiving. I've got a long way to go in living such a ministry of presence but in this season of new beginnings I am making it a goal to do my best as I attempt to do what Jesus has called us to do, to offer the love and compassion of Jesus through our presence.

My last day on this earth could have been September 12, 2024. Where would my power, or title, or position gotten me that day? How would I have answered this question, "Did I live a life that pointed to Jesus?" This experience has motivated me to take this season of new beginnings and commit to a life and ministry that allows people to know that I love them, I cared for them, and more importantly, my love and care are just mere extensions of Jesus' greater love and care for them.

I am looking forward to a true ministry of presence. After all, on each individual soul there is another story of God's grace and goodness being written. I am looking forward to sharing my story and listening to your story! What changes will you make in your life in this time of new beginnings?
